We would like to welcome Jay Carter to the District. Jay was hired January 2, 2014 as a Water and Sewer Maintenance Worker I. Welcome Jay!

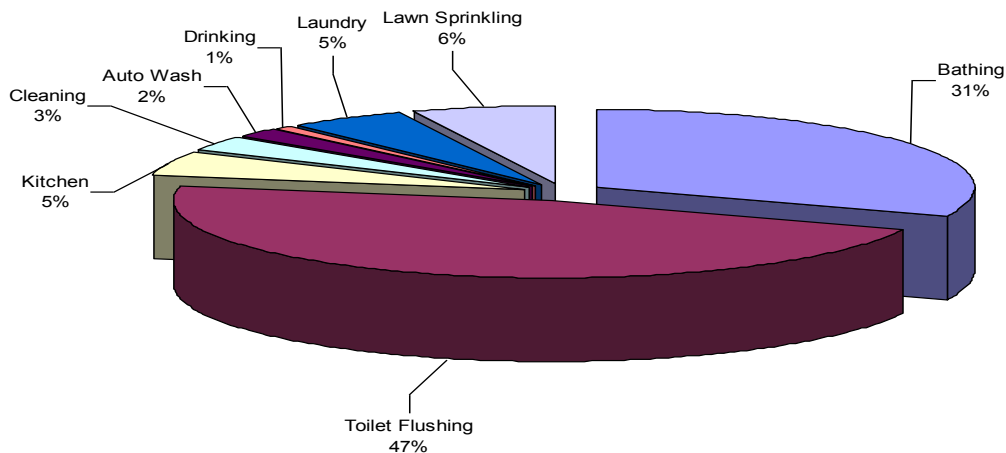
Employee Recognition

In the summer of 2005, the District opened its first coin-vending water unit that dispenses water for consumer's by the gallon. A seven-step treatment process featuring reverse-osmosis and ultraviolet light eliminates all traces leaving a perfectly clean water for all uses! Stop by our office for a free container!
