

WaterShed vending units

In the summer of 2005, the District opened its first coin-vending water unit that dispenses water for consumers by the gallon. Since then we have dispensed over \$700,000 in water sales! A seven-step treatment process featuring reverse-osmosis and ultraviolet light eliminates all traces, leaving a perfectly clean water for all uses. Stop by our office for a free container. We now have 7 locations to serve you:

- Bloomdale (located at the village's water tower)
